HISTORIC GARDEN
ACCESS REGULATIONS

This regulation governs access to and use of the historic garden of the Palazzina di Caccia di Stupinigi in a safe manner, ensuring the preservation of the beauty and integrity of its plant and animal heritage.

Visitors must behave in a conscious and respectful way towards the historical, cultural, environmental, faunal, and landscape value of the garden.

The garden is generally open:

From March 1 to October 31, Tuesday to Friday, from 10:00 AM to 4:30 PM, and Saturday, Sunday and public holidays from 10:00 AM to 5:30 PM.

CLOSED from November 1 to February 28.

Closed on Mondays.

The Administration may modify opening days and hours in case of maintenance works (ordinary or extraordinary), public or private events, redevelopment interventions, adverse weather conditions, public order requirements, or any other circumstance requiring visitor restrictions. Such changes will be communicated through appropriate means.

Entry for children under 14 is permitted only if accompanied by a parent, relative, or other authorized adult.

For school groups and group visits, access is allowed only with teachers or authorized supervisors who are responsible for supervision. Security staff may carry out any necessary checks. It is also mandatory to show the entrance ticket if requested by staff.

Entry to the garden is allowed without any personal transport devices, except those used by persons with disabilities.

It is not permitted to bring into the garden:

motorcycles, bicycles, roller skates, scooters, skateboards, balls, kites, or any object that may disturb the animals or other visitors.

Access may be authorized only for emergency vehicles or vehicles used for ordinary and extraordinary maintenance of the garden and related infrastructure.



Inside the historic garden it is forbidden to:

- Damage or deface architectural elements or garden furnishings
- Walk on lawns or grassy areas, or have picnics
- Pick flowers, climb trees, or hang from branches
- Throw any type of waste outside the designated bins
- Smoke or engage in any behaviour that may cause fire risk
- Capture or disturb wildlife
- Play ball games, dig holes, throw stones, or run in a way that disturbs other visitors
- Make loud noises or use radios
- Introduce drones or similar devices
- Damage the architectural heritage, plants, or garden furnishings. Visitors are also asked to respect the lawns by using the paths for movement
- Stop under trees during strong wind or thunderstorms

It is strictly forbidden to cross the cordon at the end of the historic garden, as it marks access to a highly dangerous area for animals, people, and property due to the presence of very old trees at risk of collapse, open pits and channels, and wild fauna.

Due to the presence of wildlife, dogs must be kept on a leash. It is also mandatory to collect pet waste and dispose of it in the appropriate bins.

The route presents hazards due to uneven terrain, non-uniform walking surfaces, stone elements (manholes, drains, etc.), and worn or slippery steps due to rain or humidity. The garden's tall trees are monitored and checked for stability, but a residual risk remains that cannot be eliminated. Visitors are therefore advised to exercise maximum caution.

Photography and video recording are not allowed except for personal use. Any other form of image or video production and distribution for commercial or remunerative purposes is subject to prior authorisation from the Administration.

The Fondazione Ordine Mauriziano declines any form of responsibility for damage to persons or property that may occur as a result of the violation of this regulation.

Please be informed that the museum areas are equipped with a video surveillance and image recording system for monitoring access and any unlawful acts.



The purchase of the ticket implicitly implies knowledge and acceptance of this visit regulation. Violators of this regulation will be immediately removed from the site.

The Administration is released from any liability for damage to persons or property caused by failure to comply with this regulation.

Motor disability: access procedures

Visitors with mobility difficulties may contact the ticket office directly before booking their visit to the Historic Garden, indicating their preferred date and time. Staff will provide all necessary information regarding accessibility conditions and, if needed, make one of the three available electric vehicles available on a rotational basis.

If no vehicle is available at the requested time and date, an alternative time will be arranged with the visitor.

The use of electric scooters is free of charge for visitors who require them; however, the vehicle is provided without a driver and the Management disclaims any responsibility for improper use or for any damage caused to third parties.

Since the number of available vehicles is limited to 3 units, reservations must be made at least 24 hours in advance in order to manage their use efficiently for the benefit of all visitors.
